

What is Picture Piecing? Picture Piecing is a unique technique that Cynthia developed to achieve detailed quilt imagery. It is similar to paper piecing in that it uses paper and straight seams. Picture Piecing has several differences, allowing quilters to achieve detailed imagery more efficiently, with less frustration and fabric waste. She was thoroughly enjoyable to listen to!
