Most importantly:

1. We need all members to donate unwanted items to DeStash..we want the tables to be full!
2. We need "Big Ticket" items that we can use as part of the Silent Auction. Such as sewing machines, cutting machines (Cricut, AccuQuilt), sewing tables, cutting tables, embroidery machines, etc.
3. There are 3 ways to donate items:
 - A. Bring the items to the church Tuesday Sept 2 between 1:30-3:30pm (Early Drop-Off)
 - B. Bring the items to the church DeStash Day Wednesday Sept 3 ; doors open at 9:00 am, DeStash starts at 10 (Regular Drop-Off)
 - C. If you're unable to bring the items, contact Donna Phelps (512-663-3751) or Stefanie Voss (832-458-6664) to arrange for your items to be picked up. Now that WVQG is a non-profit, we are able to have 2 fundraisers/year.
4. Invite quilter/sewer friends and neighbors and other people to attend!

How does this work?

Buy your bag for **\$20.00**, or as many as you want.

Browse the tables **9:30—10:00 am**. DO NOT TOUCH!

Welcome & Intro at 10 am. Bell will ring when it is time to start at 10:10 am. Cash, checks and Credit cards accepted.



What can I buy?

- Fabric-Yardage-Precuts
- Quilt Kits & Panels
- Thread-Needles
- Scissors, Rotary Cutters, Rotary Mats
- Sewing Machines, Tables, & Chairs
- Fleece, Flannel, Minky
- Quilt Books & Patterns
- Needlework (yarn)
- Shop Silent Auction items

Big Ticket items can be selected at the time of your bag purchase. After receiving a ticket for that table, you may select 1 big ticket item.
