It had fabric, notions, longarm quilting, and various sewing and quilting classes for different ages and skill levels. Her late husband, Rich, operated a shop called **The Cutting Edge** on the property. Together, they made Wimberley Stitch Studio flourish! 

Our November program brought **Teresa Duryea Wong** to us to tell about Kawaii Applique Quilts from Japan. That is also the title of a book she co-wrote with Naomi Ichikawa. She loves to travel to Japan and enjoys seeing the tiny applique dolls in the tiny quilts the women make.

Kawaii (かわいい) means “cute” in Japanese. In art, it describes a Contemporary movement characterised by exaggeratedly childlike features, round faces, oversized eyes, pastel palettes, and a sensibility rooted in innocence, play and vulnerability.
