Landscape quilts were the subject of a workshop on the following Friday.

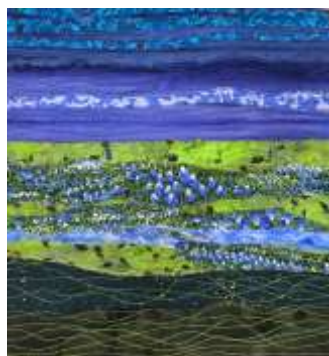
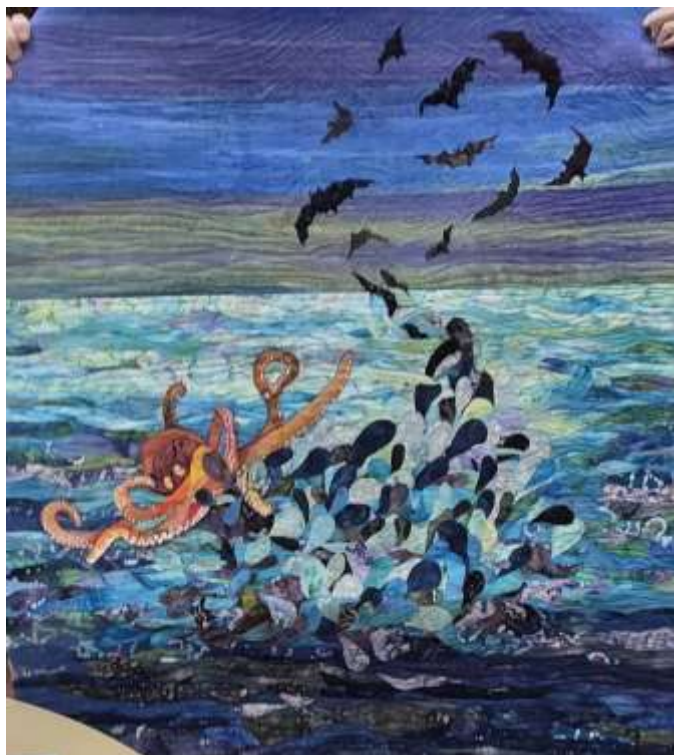


Marie was enlightening and interesting to listen to. Her stories of her experience, not always a perfect project, but she learned by what did not work.

Landscape Workshop by Marie Welsch



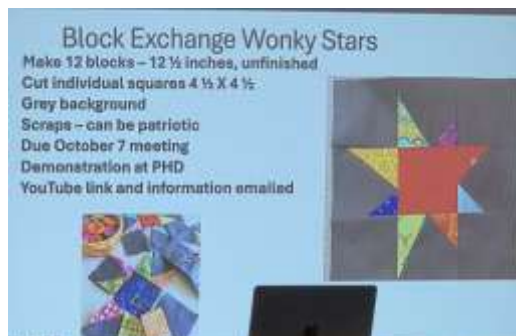
Marie brought lots of colorful fabrics for the ladies to use to make their Landscape quilts.
