Old Business

JoAnne announced the purchase of a new projector and cart (approved at the March 4, 2026 meeting) has been completed and is in use today.

New Business

JoAnne reminded everyone that election time is near. Anyone who would like to volunteer for an office or chairperson position should contact one of the Nominating Committee (Carla Woodworth or Karen Herrmann) asap.

Officer Reports

Vice President – Cheri Cheever reports that she wishes to volunteer to head the Christmas Market and the May Luncheon. She announced there is one open space for Judy Steward's "Double Wedding Ring" quilt class tomorrow (at no fee, courtesy of the person who had to cancel) and there is one open space for Marie Welsch's "Landscape" quilting class on June 3 (cost is \$45).

Treasurer – Carla Woodworth reports the projector and cart were purchased (as approved at previous business meeting). The cost was \$719.79, which was less than the approved amount of \$750.

The guild now has nonprofit status (so, tax-free) with Wal-Mart but there is a process so, any guild items to be purchased from Wal-Mart should go through Carla before purchasing.

Sales tax for income from late sales of Marketplace items will be paid.

Carla said the budget will be voted on in May, not April but, the budget draft is done. Paper copies are on each table.

Membership is 91, plus today's 2 new members.

A reminder from the Nominating Committee that the committee does not appoint. The committee only finds candidates. The president appoints.

Charity Quilts – Stefanie Voss reported that 8 Day One quilts were donated in March. The goal for the year was 4 but, 9 were donated.

10 quilts and 4 bags were donated to HCWC yesterday.

Please remember to save Hobbs batting labels and to report volunteer hours. The labels enable the guild to receive discounts on batting and the volunteer hours help HCWC and others receive funding.

A reminder that Charity Sew Days, May 8th and 15th will focus on making a “house quilt” for our Habitat For Humanity recipient. This group will meet at the Church 10 am to 3 pm. Bring your lunch, sewing machine, and notions. If you prefer to work on your own projects, bring them along.

There will be a prize for the best dressed Cowgirl so, please dress accordingly. Show And Tell will feature Cowboy/Texas/Cowgirl/Western themes. It is very important that the planners know how many people will be attending so, please remind everyone to sign up or let the committee know. Set up will be at 10:30 and meeting will begin at 11:00 with luncheon to follow.

Sunshine – Bert Nickelson reports she sent out 3 cards last month and reminded everyone to let her know when someone needs a little sunshine.

Newsletter & Social Media – Pam McGhee reminded everyone to use the current wimberleyvalleyquiltguild.org website, as the .com site is no longer functional. She demonstrated the use of tabs on the new website.
